OPENING HYMN

Leader: What is the sum of the ten commandments?

Leader: What is the preface to the ten commandments?

People: The preface to the ten commandments is in these words, I am the Lord thy God, which have brought thee out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of bondage.

Leader: What doth the preface to the ten commandments teach us?

People: The preface to the ten commandments teaches us that because God is the Lord, and our God, and redeemer, therefore we are bound to keep all his commandments.
